



It's time to pick your fabric for the 2027 Marvelous Mystery Quilt!

This quilt will be absolutely Marvelous! It is put together with mostly traditional piecing, but I want you to try new things and learn some new tips and techniques, so there is a little foundation piecing (just in one month and I will make a detailed video to help you). There are no required rulers, but I will use the Add-a-Quarter ruler for the foundation piecing and the Creative Grids 2 Peaks in 1 Triangle ruler. There will be instructions to make the units without a ruler, but the ruler is great! I will also show the Creative Grids Folded Corner Clipper as an option for another part.

The quilt is king sized and finishes at 96" x 108".

You could skip the pieced outer border which would make the quilt 84"x 96".

This project is great for quilters of all levels. My patterns and videos are written with beginners in mind. Mystery quilts are great for learning, because the project is broken down into little parts so it is not overwhelming. The key to success is accurate cutting and an accurate $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance. In January, my video will focus on these skills. Throughout the project, I will post videos showing important tips and techniques for each part. You will have access to a private Facebook group where you can ask questions, share photos, and see what other participants are making.

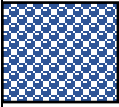

Fabric requirements:

	Fabric 1 Focus fabric and border—something you love that can help you pull together the other fabrics. This will be used in the border and in a focus block.	For a king-sized quilt, you need 2 ½ yards. If you would like to make the quilt smaller and not have the final pieced border, you need a fat quarter or 1/3 yard
Fabrics 2-3-4 can be a light, medium, and dark of one color, but they could also be different colors that coordinate. Be sure 2 is the darkest value and 4 is the lightest value. The fabrics should not blend together. They will be next to each other and the design will not show well if they do not have some contrast.		
	Fabric 2 is your darkest value	2 yards
	Fabric 3 is medium value	1 yard
	Fabric 4 is light value	1 ¾ yards
	Fabric 5 is the background All other fabrics should pop from the background	5 ½ yards
	Fabric 6 is a special pop of color. It should be a different color from your other fabric and have strong contrast to pop!	1 ¼ yards
Binding You can buy extra now, or wait until the quilt is finished to decide which fabric you would like to use.		¾ yard

You will also need backing (3 ¼ yards of wide back or 10 yards of 42" wide fabric) and batting (king sized).

Get some good neutral piecing thread. Make sure your machine is cleaned and ready to sew! The first pattern will be released on Friday, January 1 and patterns will come out on the first Friday of each month after that.
