





## My Quilting Beehive's 2020 Marvelous Mystery Quilt Month 4



I hope you are enjoying this project. This month, we will sew together some pieces from last month, and make two new sampler blocks.

First, you will need the thirteen  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares you cut last month and 2 of each of the 13 different fabric flying geese. Save the remaining 26 flying geese units for another time. We will sew the flying geese to the squares. I am matching my geese fabric with the center square fabric. You can decide if you would like to match the geese fabric to the squares or mix and match for a scrappier look.

To avoid cutting off your points when sewing the flying geese to the squares, put the flying geese unit on top of the square (right sides together) and sew your seam so it crosses through the little X formed by the seams of the triangles. Sew two units to each square on opposite sides, Press seams toward the square.



Make 13. Each unit should measure  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $6\frac{1}{2}$ "



### Sampler Block #5 Churn Dash



Cutting:

From Scrap #1 cut:

two 3" squares, one 1 1/2" x 11" rectangle, and one 2 1/2" square

From Scrap #2 cut:



two 3" squares and one 1 1/2" x 11" rectangle

Use a ruler to mark 1/4" from each side of the center diagonal on the wrong side of the 3" squares of Scrap #1 (or if you prefer mark the center diagonal then sew 1/4" away on each side of your marked line)


Layer marked square of scrap #1 with the 3" square of scrap #2, right sides together. Sew on marked lines.

Cut on center diagonal between stitched lines (red line in illustration). Press seam toward the darker fabric.

Square up to make four 2 1/2" half square triangle units.



Use a scan 1/4" seam to sew together the 1 1/2" x 11" rectangles along the long edge. Press seam toward the dark fabric. Sub-cut into 4 pieces 2 1/2" x 2 1/2"



Lay out pieces as shown.





Sew each row together.

Press seams as indicated by arrows.

Sew rows together, matching the points by nesting the seams.

Press seams toward middle row

Block should measure 6 1/2" x 6 1/2"

## Sampler Block #6 Shoo Fly



Cutting:

From Scrap #1 cut:

two 3" squares, and one 2 1/2" square

From Scrap #2 cut:






two 3" squares and four 2 1/2" squares

Use a ruler to mark 1/4" from each side of the center diagonal on the wrong side of the 3" squares of Scrap #1 (or if you prefer mark the center diagonal then sew 1/4" away on each side of your marked line)

Layer marked square of scrap #1 with the 3" square of scrap #2, right sides together. Sew on marked lines.

Cut on center diagonal between stitched lines (red line in illustration). Press seam toward the darker fabric.

Square up to make four 2 1/2" half square triangle units.



Lay out pieces as shown.

Sew each row together.

Press seams as indicated by arrows.

Sew rows together, matching the points by nesting the seams.

Press seams toward middle row

Block should measure 6 1/2" x 6 1/2"
