



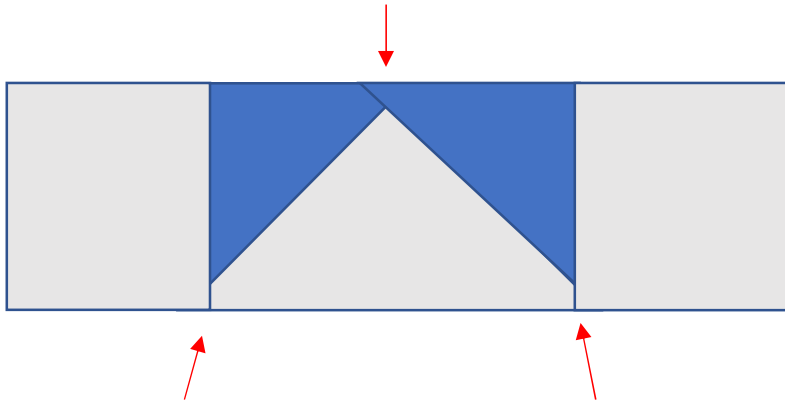
My Quilting Beehive's 2020 Marvelous Mystery Quilt Month 7



Pull out the forty-eight 3 1/2" squares you cut in Month 5.

Pull out the 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" flying geese from Month 6. You will use two of each fabric set (24 total). Put the remaining two of each fabric away until another month.

Sew a square of background fabric to each short side of the flying geese as shown in illustration. Press seams toward the squares. Make 24 units (two of each fabric set). Each should measure 12 1/2" x 3 1/2". Note—you should have 1/4" for seam allowance at the three points indicated by the red arrows.



Sampler Block #9 Framed Uneven 9-Patch

Select two fabrics from your scrap fabrics



From fabric A (purple in illustration) cut four 1 1/2" x 1 1/2" squares and four 1 1/2" x 2 1/2" rectangles

From fabric B (yellow in illustration) cut four 1 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangles, four 1 1/2" x 1 1/2" squares and one 2 1/2" x 2 1/2" square.

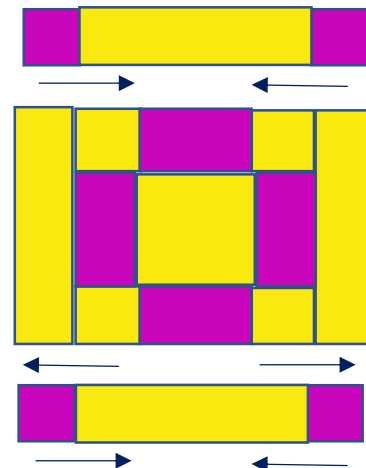
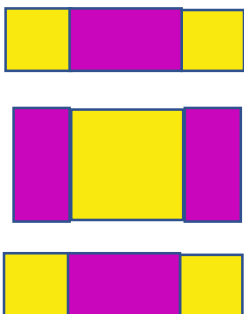
Layout 9 patch as shown (below left).

Sew each row. Press seams toward the darker fabric.

Layout border as shown (below right).

Sew each row. Press seams as indicated by arrows.

Block should measure 6 1/2" x 6 1/2"

Sampler Block #10 Ohio Star

Select two fabrics from your assorted scrap fabrics.



From fabric A, cut two 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" squares and four 2 1/2" squares

From fabric B, cut two 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" squares and one 2 1/2" squares

Use a ruler to mark 1/4" from each side of the center diagonal on the wrong side of the 3 1/2" squares of fabric A (or if you prefer mark the center diagonal then sew 1/4" away on each side of your marked line)

Layer marked square of fabric A with the 3 1/2" square of fabric B, right sides together. Sew on marked lines. Cut on center diagonal between stitched lines (red line in illustration).

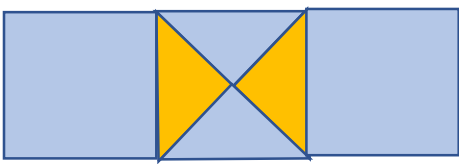
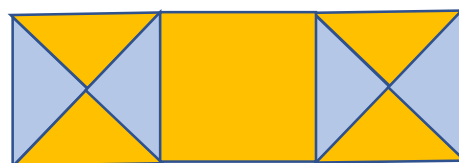
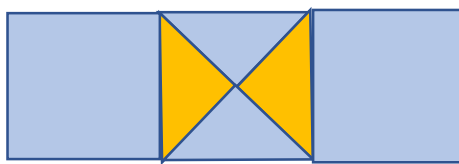
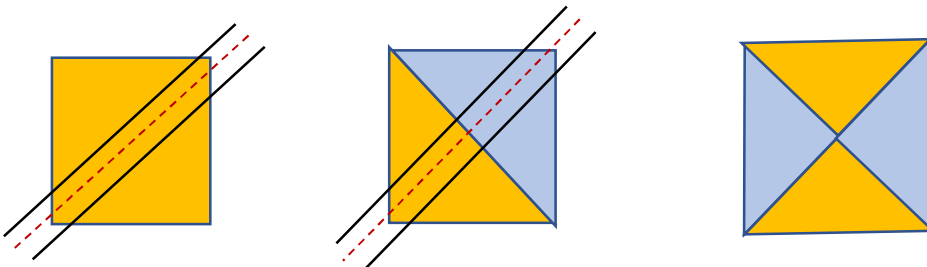
Press seam toward the darker fabric, making four half square triangles.

Mark 1/4" from each side of the center diagonal on the wrong side of two of the half square triangles as shown in illustration.

Layer two half-square triangles together with opposite fabrics matching.

Sew on the marked lines. Cut on the center diagonal between the stitched lines. Press seams open.

You should have four quarter square triangles. Trim each one to 2 1/2". Be sure to trim from all four sides to keep the point where triangles meet in the center. Line up your ruler keeping the center point at 1 1/4" from each side. Be sure the 45-degree angle line is lined up on a seam line. Layout squares and quarter square triangles as shown.

Sew each row.

Press seams toward the squares as indicated by red arrows.

Join rows, pinning to match corners. Press seams away from center row as indicated by green arrows.
